Artist P K Jena, also the Secretary of Energy Department, drew a bruised, sad, but angry face of a woman reflecting upon the December 16 Delhi gangrape case. Surrounded by monkeys who seemed to pounce upon the woman, the painting was done mostly in dark shades of red and grey.

In his paintings, Ramesh Pachpande engaged with various human emotions. Today, Ramesh has developed a unique style of charcoal paintings on paper which highlights facial expressions and brings to the fore the sublime beauty of the human form. His paintings, a reflection of his rural roots, portray the serene innocence, the charm and purity of the rural folk.
